Homework will be set by teachers of the listed subjects for completion before the next lesson of that class.

Homework for subjects listed in (brackets) above will be set in class the day before.

Homework will be set, checked and reported on by teachers.

Homework must be written in student diaries. These entries will be checked by subject teachers, tutor teachers and prep supervisors. Parents are encouraged to check these entries to assist with organisation of 'prep' / 'homework' time at home.

Only some 'core' subjects (English, Mathematics, Science & HASS) have been listed in the schedule.

Each entry represents a 15-20minute activity / set of activities that must be completed by the start of the next lesson for the listed subject.

Other core & rotational / choice subjects on the day may set homework activities to be completed by the next lesson.

Academic achievement in all subjects can be enhanced by:

- using time outside of the classroom on homework, study and assignment work; as well as
- reading, reading, reading ...

HOMEWORK is additional academic work set by the teacher to assist students to practise concepts and procedures covered in class.

STUDY is additional academic work set by the student to re-read / revise / redo activities covered in class.

ASSIGNMENT WORK is academic work set by the teacher and time managed by the student. Most subjects allow time in class to work on these types of assessment items. To complete the assessment item to a high standard, time needs to be devoted to its completion outside of the classroom.

So you think you've completed all of your prep? Have you ...

1. ... checked all your work due tomorrow is done in full? (If there is something you are stuck on, email your teacher NOW!)
2. ... missed school recently? (This includes away from school for other studies / courses / camps / expeditions / excursions / sporting event / sickness etc etc. Borrow someone else's notes; if you don't understand, make a time with your teacher to catch-up – do this NOW – send them an email with the times you are available and see if they can help.)
3. ... got exams coming up? (Start revision early by reading through your notes from this term, trying some questions that you did in class and making revision cards or posters. If you do it now, there is less to do in exam block.)

If you still have no school work to do, use your time wisely by looking up work experience opportunities, research University or TAFE courses or reading an extended piece of text (novel, newspaper, magazine) that will further your knowledge. Your time is precious – don't waste it!!
