VET (Vocational Education and Training) Courses*

See the Academic Dean for the latest courses offered in the local region.

- 1. VET courses are offered by "RTOs" (Registered Training Organisations).
- There are a number of RTOs who conduct their courses completely "online" while others offer traditional "on-site" workshop / classroom modes of delivery.
- 3. Some RTOs are based at the "DTTC" (Dalrymple Trade Training Centre) a second campus of our school.
- 4. Government funding known as "VETis funding" (Vocational Education & Training in Schools funding) will cover the course cost for one Certificate I or Certificate II course for school students in their senior phase of learning.
- 5. Please note that there is an additional school fee of \$250 charged for each "on-site" VET course undertaken at DTTC to cover additional administration and transportation costs associated with the course.
- 6. Students completing a VET course at the DTTC that requires a full day out of school are required to have Essential English in their school timetable on lines 1&4. The school timetable then allows for the missed school day at DTTC by scheduling 4 of the additional 5 Essential English lessons on the DTTC day. This limits missed school lesson time. Students requiring "General English" for their career pathway will be accommodated with other individual adjustments.

- For a subject change to be finalised, students or Parents / Cares Givers must make contact with the Academic Dean by the time and dates listed below.
- These timelines have been set to allow students time to settle into classes for a <u>full semester / senior unit</u> without the disruption of excessive 'class swapping'.
- The impact upon eligibility for the Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) in Years 11 & 12 is also a major contributor to this set of timelines.

YEARS 11&12 'STUDY LESSON'

A Year 11 or 12 'Study Lesson' is only offered to students in the following categories:

- 1. Students undertaking a VET Certificate II (or higher) course online.
- 2. Students undertaking one-day per week Work Placement or on-the-job training for Apprenticeship / Traineeship.
- 3. Overall Position (OP) eligible Year 12 students in 2019 are able to <u>apply</u> for a 'Study Lesson'. The opinions of subject teachers and the Year Co-ordinator will be sought before the Academic Dean makes a recommendation to the Headmaster for the 'Study Lesson' to be granted or rejected.
